Additional Text: Proverbs 22:1; Isaiah 62:2; Isaiah 9:6

Names are an important part of our self-identification. Some might say a name is merely a label on the person, that the true identity is seen through his or her actions and inactions. Others will stand by their belief that everything is in the name. Hence, we see Sr. Jr. II, III, IV ... attached to a name. It is interesting that this is typically seen on the male side and not the female.

There could easily be a Patrick Sr., or Patrick Schultz III, if only my dad and grandpa had been with the program! But, there is no Kathleen the II. Nor Joanne the V.

In the Gospel of Matthew, much of the first chapter is dedicated to names ~ from Abraham to Joseph to Jesus, the lineage is listed. Throughout the Old Testament names are found, sometimes unpronounceable, but given nonetheless. Seraiah, Azariah, Jeremiah, Pashhur, Amariah, Malchijah... can be found in Nehemiah 10 as the list of officials, Levites and priests on the seal of a commitment to follow the instructions as given by the Lord. They pen their names much as our country's leaders did with the Declaration of Independence.

Why are names so important? Because they are important to God. God gave the first human being the task of naming all wild animals and birds. God changed the name of Abram to Abraham and Sari to Sarah and later the name of Jacob to Israel. And then Saul to Paul.

And then there are the unnamed. The homeless woman on the street; the child running through the worst part of town – no parents, no guardians, just trying to stay alive, warm, and fed. The countless unnamed immigrants trying to reach safety. We may not know their names, but God does. God knows who they. And thank God for that.
