Genesis 25:27-34 ESV

When the boys grew up, Esau was a skillful hunter, a man of the field, while Jacob was a quiet man, dwelling in tents. Isaac loved Esau because he ate of his game, but Rebekah loved Jacob.

Once when Jacob was cooking stew, Esau came in from the field, and he was exhausted. And Esau said to Jacob, "Let me eat some of that red stew, for I am exhausted!" (Therefore his name was called Edom.) Jacob said, "Sell me your birthright now." Esau said, "I am about to die; of what use is a birthright to me?" Jacob said, "Swear to me now." So he swore to him and sold his birthright to Jacob. Then Jacob gave Esau bread and lentil stew, and he ate and drank and rose and went his way. Thus Esau despised his birthright.

Genesis 27:30-36 ESV

As soon as Isaac had finished blessing Jacob, when Jacob had scarcely gone out from the presence of Isaac his father, Esau his brother came in from his hunting. He also prepared delicious food and brought it to his father. And he said to his father, "Let my father arise and eat of his son's game, that you may bless me." His father Isaac said to him, "Who are you?" He answered, "I am your son, your firstborn, Esau." Then Isaac trembled very violently and said, "Who was it then that hunted game and brought it to me, and I ate it all before you came, and I have blessed him? Yes, and he shall be blessed." As soon as Esau heard the words of his father, he cried out with an exceedingly great and bitter cry and said to his father, "Bless me, even me also, O my father!" But he said, "Your brother came deceitfully, and he has taken away your blessing." Esau said, "Is he not rightly named Jacob? For he has cheated me these two times. He took away my birthright, and behold, now he has taken away my blessing." Then he said, "Have you not reserved a blessing for me?"

Additional Text: Phil 1:6; Genesis 25, 27-32; Heb 11:21

Jacob, a shady, manipulative, lying, opportunist stoops so far as to cheat his older brother out of his inheritance; and lies to/tricks his father as he is dying. Through all the shady and despicable actions that debased his life, God's love was unabating but never tolerant of his sinful ways. For many years Jacob chose his own path and along the way learned many painful lessons of "human independence" and the cost of "going it alone."

Eventually, Jacob contrived his way into a final crisis which God had been preparing for him.

Jacob's life illustrates not so much his perseverance and eventual pursuit of a saintly life, rather the perseverance of God. If it weren't for God, any pursuit of saintliness on Jacob's behalf would be impossible. Much like Israel who balked against God time after time, followed its own pursuits and discounted God's guidance; only God's perseverance, patience, unconditional love, and blessing allowed Israel to realize God's purpose for them.

Paul expressed that God knows no unfinished task. God will keep working until the task is complete according to His purpose.

Prayer: Lord, have your way with us and continue you work in and through us. In Christ's holy name. *Amen*.
