1 Corinthians 12:12-20, 27

For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit.

Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot would say, "Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear would say, "Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body," that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? If the whole body were hearing, where would the sense of smell be? But as it is, God arranged the members in the body, each one of them, as he chose. If all were a single member, where would the body be? As it is, there are many members, yet one body.

Now you are the body of Christ and individually members of it.

Additional Text: Mark 10:32-45; 16:12-20

What is most important to us? Making a difference in someone's life?

Whether our deepest desire is to make a difference in our children's lives or in the lives of thousands, how we live our lives and conduct ourselves can be held to that point. Think of those who have made a difference in your life.

Was it the Super Bowl MVP 5-10 years ago? Do you even remember who was the MVP 5 years ago? Maybe the academy award winners of last year? The Indy 500 champ? Your favorite TV or movie star? There are so many iconic figures in our lives that we sometimes try to pattern ourselves after, and that's not necessarily a bad thing. Although, that does depend on the character of that person.

I admire those who have made such achievements in their lives; but I don't covet their life, nor do I pattern myself after them. I do, however, remember my Sunday school teachers and the understanding of Christianity they imparted upon me. They helped me to see Jesus in a new and exciting way. I remember VBS leaders who told a biblical story in a new way – engaging my imagination and heart. I remember my high school English teacher, Mr. Stohl, who saw some gift in my writing and helped me to develop those skills. I remember my pastor who saw something in me and kept encouraging me to develop in ministry and because of all of this I am who I am today.

These have been just some of the difference makers in my life. They live through the person I have become – as well as countless others they influenced. How about you? Who are your difference makers? Are you a difference maker?

Soup-er Bowl Sunday
