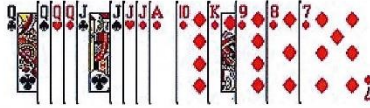

Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

Pray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others.

Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

Karl Barth, theologian, philosopher, writer, gives definition to “saint” in these terms. “Holy people are unholy people who nevertheless as such have been singled out, claimed and requisitioned by God for his control, for his use, for himself who is holy. Their holiness is and remains in Christ Jesus. It is in him that they are holy, it is from this point of view that they are to be addressed as such, in no other respect.”

Essentially, Barth is saying that Paul’s way of thinking is no one does anything to become a “holy” person or a “saint.” Rather, believers are holy only insofar as Christ’s holiness is given to them. This is an interesting line of thought, and if I break this down further, it’s saying no one is holy except in and through Jesus. No one can claim holiness separate from God through the Son.

To further this thought, the Holy Spirit, called and sent to us by the Son, fills us with the flame of holiness (think Pentecost Sunday). This holiness is known as sanctifying grace. It is a grace, freely given to us by God, that sanctifies us prior to any works we might do in His name.

Being a Christian is more than simply acknowledging God’s will. It is accepting God’s will upon our lives and living out a life committed to Christ. The process of becoming more and more obedient to God’s will after being set apart by Christ’s redemption sanctifies us – cleanses us – helps ready us in our pursuit of God’s will. Hence, the freely offered gift of grace, never earned and never worthy of, is a necessary part of our relationship with God. Given and accepted if we are to deepen our relationship with God.

Prayer: Lord, thankful we are for your amazing grace that saved us, once lost but now found, blind but now seeing. Amen.
