Brief Update from the Mission & Vision Team:

The Mission/Vision team has been meeting the first Saturday of every month since November 2022. The primary goal of this team is to collaboratively develop two areas of focus and commitment and put them into meaningful words which will steer our actions. This team will focus on a mission statement and core values providing further definition of whom we are as a church, what our vision and direction are as the local church; and a missions assessment process that evaluates pastoral ministry, church ministry, and church leadership ministry.

Three surveys have been developed which we will send to our congregations and regular attendees in staggered fashion. These are Ministry Assessment surveys to help determine the areas we excel in, and the areas we need to focus on. It also solicits your input with where you see the church and church ministries headed.

The three survey assessments are:

Church Ministry – we plan on sending this out at the beginning of April.

Pastoral Ministry – following the return of Church Ministry

Church Leadership – following the return of Pastoral Ministry.

Additionally, we plan on hosting round tables, small group meetings following worship services for any who want to talk with the team directly. This will begin sometime after Easter.

My friends, we need your input. While this is Christ's church, Christ has made each of us stewards of St. Mark's and St. James. You will be an integral part of developing the mission statement and core values which will help guide us into the future. The same core values and mission statement will also shape our ministry and missions now. Without your support and participation, we will really just be spinning our wheels!

The first survey (Church Ministry) will be sent out soon. It will be emailed or mailchimp'd. We'll also send hard copies to those without access to the internet. We'll have some copies at each church as well. Thank you for your support, your prayers, and your input.

ST. MARK'S CONSISTORY MEETING

The financial report was read by Judy and reviewed by the consistory. Larry voted to accept the report and Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried.

We will notify the congregation via inserts in bulletins and email regarding the balance of the parsonage loan in hopes of getting it paid off sooner. Larry will also announce in church on 4/2/23.

A motion was made by Linda to accept the Secretary's report and the motion was seconded by Larry. Motion carried.

The Mission/Vision team continues to meet and discuss questions and give updates to the congregation. Considering senior ministry with hopes of offering upcoming activities and needing a coordinator for the activities.

The drywall is being worked on in the church office. Larry will be completing in March and discussed putting in a ceiling fan for better airflow.

Larry will check with Fasse Paint on the cost of painting the parking lot lines.

A letter will be sent out by pastor to both congregations with our decision to hold off on changing the times of church service until next year when we have another good year of stability.

Pastor will apply for a grant to help offset the cost of a bookshelf and books to start a church library.

Louise Jetzer and Sheila Hemb will take over our youth fellowship account at Cleveland State Bank. We will notify the bank of our approval of changing names on the current account via the meeting minutes per the bank's request. A motion was made by Linda Schroeder and seconded by Janell Davis to remove Kari Langenhahn's name and replace the account names with Louise Jetzer and Sheila Hemb. Motion carried.

Larry made a motion to allow as much as \$2500 to be written out with only one signature needed and any checks over \$2500 would require two signatures. Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried.

The youth group and Sunday school leaders will be asked by Linda if they would consider baking cookies with the remainder of the cookie jars that did not sell during their fundraiser and have a bake sale and the profits could be used for the mission trip.

Glenn will research options for getting the annual state elevator inspection completed.

Our next consistory meeting will be 4/13/23 at 6:30 p.m.

Larry made a motion to adjourn and Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried.


Old Business:





Dear friends in Christ,

Grace and greetings to you in these early days of springtime. The birds are singing, and green shoots are pushing through the crusty, cold ground. All creation is preparing to give birth to new life.

In anticipation of Easter we, too, are experiencing a season of renewal. I pray God's Holy Spirit is awakening your spirit during this season of Lent, even amid the troubles of the world and the challenges of these times. This morning, I heard a longtime journalist reflect on the reality that "acceptable disagreements" are hard to come by in these contentious days. All too often, it seems, our culture opts for a combative tone rather than an understanding one, forgetting that reconciliation doesn't require us to see eye to eye on every issue. Instead, we can transcend our differences and thereby see the face of Christ in each other.

The gift of springtime and the glory of Easter bring us a choice. We can cling to the age-old potentially destructive responses that come to us at times of loss, grief, bitterness and pain. Or, in faith, we can choose hope over despair, love over hate, kindness over mean-spiritedness, healing over hurt.

John Macleod Campbell Crum was an Anglican priest and hymn writer in the early 20th century who wrote the familiar lyrics to "Now the Green Blade Riseth." The last verse is particularly compelling:

When our hearts are wintry, grieving or in pain, Jesus' touch can call us, back to life again, Fields of our hearts, that dead and bare have been: Love is come again like wheat that springeth green.

Green blades are rising in the life of our Conference these days. Here are a few updates:

- The Trost Center will soon be sold and transformed into a holistic health care clinic. April 12th the Conference offices will move to the lower level of Spring Grove Lodge at Daycholah Center. The new address for the Wisconsin Conference UCC is W1000 Spring Grove Road, Ripon, WI 54971
- The Conference Staff continues to work a hybrid schedule, with some in the Daycholah office each week Tuesday through Thursday, and once-a-month in-person gatherings of the entire group. The main phone number remains the same 608-846-7880. It will ring Monday-Friday business hours to the cellphones of Susan Taylor, Nola Risse-Connolly or Tracy Hauge, who will route your call.
- This is the season of annual meetings, with each association scheduled for a Saturday gathering in late April or early May. The Conference Annual Meeting, titled *Changing Church: Following Jesus Forward*, will be held June 9-10, with dynamic education days on June 8th & 11th.
- Applications for delegates to the General Synod of the United Church of Christ, which will be held in Indianapolis this summer, Talk with Pastor if you're interested in applying.

Finally, thank you for your continued faithfulness to your local congregation. We are seeing signs of springtime and renewal in the life of the Church in this post-pandemic era. There remains a spiritual hunger in our communities, and a desire to serve. The voice of inclusion in the United Church of Christ has never been more important. Our advocacy and action on justice issues is essential. And our establishing of sacred places for worship creates a sense of belonging that traces all the way back to the Church of the apostles.

In a spirit of hope and resilience, I send blessings and best wishes to you all!
