Pastoral Prayer:

In this meal, we remember Jesus, his promises, and the price he paid for who he was, what he said, and what he did; for our benefit.

On the night before Jesus died, he took a loaf of bread, Gave thanks, broke it, and said,

Take and eat, this is my body, given for you.

Do this, in remembrance of me.

After supper, Jesus took the cup and poured, saying,

This is the cup of the new covenant,

poured out for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sins.

Do this in remembrance of me.

In sharing this meal, we live out the mystery of our faith:

P: We remember Christ's life of love, and friendship, and teaching,

P: We remember Christ's dying, and rising to life again.

Bless this bread and this cup, the wheat and the grape, the farmer and the harvest, the seed and the sower. These simple elements are shared in community, so that we may taste and see your goodness and become one body in Christ.

P: For it is through Christ, in Christ, and with Christ, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, that all glory is yours, God most holy, now and forevermore. *Amen.*
