John 2: 1-11 On the third day there was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus also was invited to the wedding with his disciples. When the wine ran out, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, what does this have to do with me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you."

Now there were six stone water jars there for the Jewish rites of purification, each holding twenty or thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water." And they filled them up to the brim. And he said to them, "Now draw some out and take it to the master of the feast." So they took it. When the master of the feast tasted the water now become wine, and did not know where it came from (though the servants who had drawn the water knew), the master of the feast called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves the good wine first, and when people have drunk freely, then the poor wine. But you have kept the good wine until now." This, the first of his signs, Jesus did at Cana in Galilee, and manifested his glory. And his disciples believed in him.

Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God. Pray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others. Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

Additional Text: Judges 14:12, Matt. 25:1, Mark 2:18-20

Following a public betrothal (engagement) the family would announce the wedding date, and elaborate preparations were made for a celebration that could last a week! Gift giving was carefully considered, not as a simple goodwill gesture, but as a means of bringing honor to the couple and their families. To not follow tradition had legal ramifications, as it brought shame upon the couple.

Hence, when the host ran out of wine, the servants were very concerned. The wedding party did not serve grape juice, but wine. That Jesus was present was a testament to his ministry. When Jesus was asked why he and his disciples did not fast, his response was that his presence should inspire celebration not asceticism.

There are a number of ways to view this story. One viewpoint John wants us to reflect on is: this miracle in Cana is less important than the implication of Jesus' arrival, now, in the setting of Judaism.

John is making a statement that Judaism is to see and hear. The Messiah has arrived, and the messianic banquet (seen as a wedding feast) has begun.

Prayer: O what a joy to celebrate your coming, Lord Jesus. It's like a party that never ceases. Sure, there are many daily "puffs of wind" threatening to blow out the candles, but your presence with us is a reminder the light never goes out and the darkness need never overwhelm us. *Amen*.
