1 Corinthians 15:12-19 ESV

Now if Christ is proclaimed as raised from the dead, how can some of you say that there is no resurrection of the dead? But if there is no resurrection of the dead, then not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, then our preaching is in vain and your faith is in vain. We are even found to be misrepresenting God, because we testified about God that he raised Christ, whom he did not raise if it is true that the dead are not raised. For if the dead are not raised, not even Christ has been raised. And if Christ has not been raised, your faith is futile and you are still in your sins. Then those also who have fallen asleep in Christ have perished. If in Christ we have hope in this life only, we are of all people most to be pitied.

Grow - deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

Pray - pray daily for family, neighbors, and others.

Study - read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

Additional Text: 1 Corinthians 20-58

The question is, "How are the dead raised?" The answer is, "We don't know for certain."

But, see how Paul talks about it in this chapter of Corinthians which teaches about the resurrection of Jesus from the dead. God will raise up new bodies; whether it is scraping together the dust of the original body and refashioning it, or whether it is giving a new one. We believe that he's going to do something of this nature for one reason only, because he raised up Christ from the dead. And we know that he did it.

Death isn't an end; it is a brief passageway into an unspeakable glory. Therefore, encourage one another with these things. Paul's teaching of course, is for believers only, people committed to Christ. Those who have not committed themselves to Christ have chosen to live their lives independently of God, and God choose not to infringe upon their liberty. But consider this thought – an eternity of independence from God.

Prayer: Lord, I commit myself to you in all ways. You are my Lord, Savior and Redeemer. Guide my every thought, action and direction in life that I may be the one you have created me to be. *Amen*.

Kelly Tiegs, Director of Canine Operations Kelly joined D2DT after working with at-risk dogs with various rescues and shelters. Kelly brings many years of training experience and is currently working towards her certification.

Dogs2DogTag rescues at-risk dogs, trains them, and provides them to Veterans suffering from PTSD and other post-combat anxiety disorders.
