Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.


## Additional Text: Phil. 4:4-7; Zeph. 3:14-20; Luke 3:7-18

Though there is a quietness to Advent, a hushed waiting for something to be revealed, something to be born, it is also a time of deep joy. This is a Sunday to celebrate the joy of the season, the joy of waiting, and the joy of having already received the one for whom we wait. So, set up the dance floor, blow up the balloons, serve refreshments in the narthex. Let's make this day, at least—if not every time we gather for worship—a celebration of joy and hope.

This is not a denial of challenges or hurdles we face. This is not implying that there are no more tears in our waiting time. But it does mean that we can learn to hope, even in difficult moments in our lives. We don't proclaim sunshine and roses for everyone all the time, what some call the "happy-clappy" worship. There is depth here and honesty, even as we celebrate the goodness of God. Let us find our way to that joy, however loud or quiet it might be. But we trust that it is there.

What is your most joy filled Christmas you've ever had? Was it coming home after being gone for a long time? Was it having sons, daughters, grandchildren come to your home, after not seeing them for quite a while? Or a reconciliation time with a broken relationship?

**Prayer**: A singing God! Isn't that what we all hope for? In the midst of troubles, struggles, and a world gone wild, we hope not only that God delights in us individually, but also that God sings over the entire world a melody of renewal. Zephaniah declared God would quiet our hearts with love and rejoice, even as God mightily delivers us. In Advent, we hope in hope *Amen*.



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
