Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

Pray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others.

Additional Text:

Jeremiah 15:1; Hebrews 13:16; 2 Corinthians 10:13-16; Galatians 6:4

Have you ever thought to yourself – our world could be a better place to live? If only... That thought has been prevalent throughout the ages. God thought it could be better. And God sometimes took steps to help make the world a better place. We know the story of Noah and the Ark; or Moses and the Exodus; or the prophets of the Old Testament who spoke to the people on behalf of God. Nothing seemed to work really. So, God came to live among us ~ Jesus, Son of God.

While that has made a world of difference for all of us, I can safely say our world still has a long way to go. As followers of Christ we are called to be influencers ~ to make a difference in our world. Yet, a far-reaching grasp of influence – like that of Malala, Amanda Gorman, Greta Thunberg, Mother Theresa, Martin Luther King Jr, John Donne or Gandhi – intimidate us. And we wonder (to the point of inaction at times) how can I possibly do what they did?

Here's the thing. God never has and does not call us to change the world, the whole world, all by ourselves. God calls us to love Him; love our neighbors; to do justice, to love kindness and to walk humbly with God. We are called to help change the world one person at a time; one day at a time; one ministry at a time. I agree with Mother Theresa who told us "Not all of us can do great things. But we can all do small things with great love." What small things with great love can you do?

Here are seven streams of influence – that influence us. Are there others you can think of: Church. Government. Arts and Entertainment. Education. Business. Media. Family.

Prayer: Gracious God, we might not be able to paint the whole world, but we can color in a small spot. Guide us, move us, strengthen us to answer your call to each of us. *Amen*.
