We all desire to make a difference in our own world. I believe wholeheartedly that we make a difference in the lives closest to us: our spouse, our siblings, our children. The greater question is what kind of difference are we making? Are we positive, healthy, godly influencers to those closest to us? How are we influencing those a step removed – beyond our closest intimates? How does our influencing reflect how we lead others?

Many of us think we're not leaders, we think that kind of influence is for others. But the truth is we are all leaders (all influencers). God has given us the gift of influence. When you read Psalm 34:11-20, write down the thoughts that come to mind about how God plants desires in each of us, when we delight in Him.

When you read Proverbs 16:1-9, ask yourself ~ what would happen if the whole church began to ask God for those moments that can make a difference in others' lives?

What passion has God put in your heart? If you don't know, ask God to show you what He's putting in you. If you do know, think about how you can use that passion to make a difference where you are. Make a list of those you consider to be in your sphere of influence. Ask God to create moments for you to impact their lives this week.

The secret to changing the world we live in is using our influence to make a difference for the Kingdom of God. Let that be our intent.

Prayer: Lord, grant us confidence in the gifts you have given to us that they may be used to transform our world – for the kingdom of God. *Amen*.
