#### **PSALM 33:1-12 NIV**

Sing joyfully to the LORD, you righteous; it is fitting for the upright to praise him.

Praise the LORD with the harp;
make music to him on the ten-stringed lyre.

Sing to him a new song;
play skillfully, and shout for joy.

For the word of the LORD is right and true; he is faithful in all he does. The LORD loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of his unfailing love.

By the word of the LORD the heavens were made, their starry host by the breath of his mouth. He gathers the waters of the sea into jars; he puts the deep into storehouses.

Let all the earth fear the LORD; let all the people of the world revere him.

For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded, and it stood firm.

The LORD foils the plans of the nations; he thwarts the purposes of the peoples.

But the plans of the LORD stand firm forever, the purposes of his heart through all generations.

Blessed is the nation whose God is the LORD, the people he chose for his inheritance.

# **GPS**

Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

**P**ray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others.

Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

#### **Additional Text:**

*Psalm 33* – read the entire chapter (22 verses) three verses a day. Write down thoughts, inspiration, meaning that comes to you in your readings.

Psalm 33 uses an introductory word in verse 12, "Blessed" Some translations use "Happy" instead. Either are apt translations from the original Hebrew. The two words, however, can carry different connotations with us today. Happy leaves the reader thinking – smiley, uplifted, joyful – jovial... which is not what the Psalmist is trying to convey.

Blessed *can* mean those things; but it carries a much deeper meaning. <u>Israel is "blessed" above all other nations</u> because the righteous God who created the world and all things seen and unseen has sovereign authority over the Israel people. (This is much different than, <u>Israel is happy above all other nations...)</u>

God has chosen Israel for a special relationship. Israel has become, by divine election, God's inheritance. This inheritance of relationship is inalienable and cannot be take away. This deep and meaningful relationship is a means of reaching other peoples.

Being "blessed" is a first step in urging the listener to trust in their God. Listening to God when he speaks, "For he spoke, and it came to be; he commanded and it stood firm." In God's divine relationship Israel is held to a higher standard of Yahweh's righteousness. This is necessary, for how can the peoples of the world learn from Israel if they are as the rest of the world? Much like being a Christian today. If we want non-Christians to know the love and acceptance of Christ – we must live our lives by a higher standard.

Prayer: We sing for joy; praise you and give thanks for all you are to us. Blessed is the nation whose God is Lord. *Amen*.
