John 5:17-23

But Jesus answered them, "My Father is working until now, and I am working." This was why the Jews were seeking all the more to kill him, because not only was he breaking the Sabbath, but he was even calling God his own Father, making himself equal with God.

So Jesus said to them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, the Son can do nothing of his own accord, but only what he sees the Father doing. For whatever the Father does, that the Son does likewise For the Father loves the Son and shows him all that he himself is doing. And greater works than these will he show him, so that you may marvel. For as the Father raises the dead and gives them life, so also the Son gives life to whom he will. For the Father judges no one, but has given all judgment to the Son, that all may honor the Son, just as they honor the Father. Whoever does not honor the Son does not honor the Father who sent him.

Additional Text:

The longest paragraph we read in the Apostles' Creed has to do with the Son of God, Jesus Christ. This is so, because Christology varied the most; was challenged the most; and had followers whose beliefs differed most widely from the church.

We are told Jesus Christ is the "Son of God". Other variants read, "The Son of the Same" or "His Son." Of importance is that Jesus, Son of God rules over this world and over all reality. Subsequently, the birth of "Mary the virgin" is not in the Creed to stress the virgin birth – although that is quite clearly confirmed – but rather to affirm the very fact that Jesus was born. He did not simply appear on earth. The reference to Pontius Pilate is not to put blame on the Roman government, but to date the event to insist on the fact that it was a historical, datable event.

Further "docetism" is denied by declaring that Jesus was "crucified... died, and rose again" And finally, affirming this same Jesus will return to judge. Docetism is defined as the doctrine that Christ's body wasn't human. It was either of celestial substance or a phantasm. Broadly speaking, it is taken as the belief that Jesus only *seemed* to be human, that his human form was all an illusion. [This is only one of many false teachings, or heresies the Apostles' Creed sought to clarify. Ultimately however, the battle continued around the issue of authority. Who decided who was right and who was wrong?]

Prayer: At times Lord, doubt can creep in. We wonder what is really true especially when we hear conflicting "authorities" give contradictory testimony. Regardless, it is our faith and belief in you, Creator of all that is seen and unseen; Lord and Savior, that we trust in. Remove foolish thoughts from our heads and let us rest peacefully in the assurance of your mercy, your love, your grace and your might. *Amen*.
