Additional Text:

Psalm 98:8-9Psalm 51 (note: Vs 2, 7, 10) Romans 10:1-15

The second coming of Christ, expressed so many times throughout scripture, is a turning point for all creation. Christ will usher in peace, healing, forgiveness and salvation along with judgement.

For many it is a pleasing thought to think that when Jesus comes it means salvation for all. But it's less pleasing to think that judgement will also be taking place. I mean, I'm all for saving! But I'm not sure I want to be judged. After all, I know what a questionable character I've been in the past! Is that going to impact Christ's decision on whether I am part of the final call?

Truth is we cannot have salvation without judgement. Judgement is an integral part of the work of salvation. If judgement is not a part of salvation, then what is it we are being saved from? Are we being saved from wounds, illness, age, persecution...? Yes, but primarily we are being saved from ourselves and our sinful natures. This requires a system of justice in which our sins are reviewed and then judged upon by Christ. Let me be clear – this is not a "I'm trying to scare you straight" type message. It is merely the truth revealed to us in scripture and the gospel story.

What we know of Christ is that he is merciful, loving and filled with grace. He is forgiving (think of the crucified thief/murderer next to him on the cross). He is understanding of all we live through on a daily basis (he lived these days with us). With head held high and with joy, we confess that Christ will come to judge the living and the dead. We don't want to mess with that understanding. But we fearlessly place our trust in the grace of Jesus

Prayer: Lord, deepen our faith and trust in you. For the sake of our souls and the life we live. *Amen.*
