

Additional Text: Deut. 20:5-7; Lev. 21:17-23; 1Cor. 1:26-31

In this parable I believe that the one who has made the invitation and inviting to the supper is none other than God. And the reference is to the marriage supper of the Lamb. And these are some of the excuses that people give for not coming to Jesus Christ.

The first man's excuse was sort of a commercial excuse: "I bought a house and I need to go take a look at it." Now who in their right mind, I ask, would buy a house without looking at it? He was too busy in commerce.

The second man is busy in his labors. Too busy working and it takes precedence over the kingdom. "I bought five yoke and I need to prove them." In other words, he needs to test them – to make sure this has been a good buy. But again, I say what man would buy five yoke of oxen without *first* testing them? Which of you would buy a car without driving it around the block?

Then the third said that he had just married a wife and couldn't come. Why didn't he bring along his wife?

You notice that they all began to make excuses. There is a difference between excuses and reasons. Sometimes you can make an excuse when you don't have any real reason for it. But I would warn you as Benjamin Franklin said, "The man who is good at making excuses is seldom good for anything else."

They began to make excuses for different reasons, so the lord said to go out into the highways and bring in the poor, the maimed and the halt. Remember to Jesus, He fulfilled the prophecy to the poor, the gospel is being preached. And still there was room, so he was to go out into the highways and byways and compel them to come in, and the gospel was being preached compelling all to come into the kingdom of God.
