Scripture Reading:

1 Corinthians 10:1-13 ESV

For I do not want you to be unaware, brothers, that our fathers were all under the cloud, and all passed through the sea, and all were baptized into Moses in the cloud and in the sea, and all ate the same spiritual food, and all drank the same spiritual drink. For they drank from the spiritual Rock that followed them, and the Rock was Christ. Nevertheless, with most of them God was not pleased, for they were overthrown in the wilderness.

Now these things took place as examples for us, that we might not desire evil as they did. Do not be idolaters as some of them were; as it is written, "The people sat down to eat and drink and rose up to play." We must not indulge in sexual immorality as some of them did, and twenty-three thousand fell in a single day. We must not put Christ to the test, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents, nor grumble, as some of them did and were destroyed by serpents happened to them as an example, but they were written down for our instruction, on whom the end of the ages has come. Therefore let anyone who thinks that he stands take heed lest he fall. No temptation has overtaken you that is not common to man. God is faithful, and he will not let you be tempted beyond your ability, but with the temptation he will also provide the way of escape, that you may be able to endure it.

Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God. Pray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others. Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

"When you are tempted, he will show you a way out."

Two children were fighting. When the dad separated them, he asked the older brother, "Can you think of any reasons why it might not be a good idea to beat up on your little sister? The boy immediately listed a number of reasons why he shouldn't be fighting.

The dad was amazed! *He knows this speech better than I do*, he thought to himself. Then he tried a different question. "Can you give me any reasons why you think you *should* beat up your sister?" Here the conversation completely changed tone. Tearfully, the young boy recounted the many injustices he felt that he had endured and the lack of support he felt he was getting from the adults around him.

From that conversation emerged a deeper understanding between the father and the son; and too an understanding that helped the son outgrow his pattern of fighting with his sister.

When we are tempted, God looks to us to share what's really going on in our hearts. When we do this, we create room for him to forge a new understanding and a deeper relationship with us so those temptations begin to lose their power in our lives.

How would you finish this sentence: Dear God, if I could talk to you about anything, I would tell you...

Prayer: Dear Lord, we face so many temptations throughout the day. You know our weaknesses. You know where we are most susceptible to giving in. In those areas of our lives give us the strength, the courage, the endurance and guidance we need in order to overcome. We pray this in Jesus' precious name. *Amen*.

WELCOME!

To the parents of young children:

Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress those wiggles in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to engage.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and the actions of the pastors, musicians and leaders.
- Sing the songs, pray and voice the responses. Children learn behaviors by mimicking you.
- If you have to leave the Worship Center with your child, feel free to do so, but please come back. As Jesus said, "Let the little children come to me."
