THE PASSING OF THE PEACE:

Let us take a moment to greet one another with the words, "The peace of Christ be with you," and "Also with you."

PSALM 50:1-15

(We are about to pray the words of Psalm 50. Notice that this prayer begins with several acclamations about God. Long about verse 7, we hear from God. After identifying human actions that are not helpful, God finally identifies God's hopeful desire from us.....)

The mighty one, God the Lord, speaks and summons the earth from the rising of the sun to its setting.

Out of Zion, the perfection of beauty, God shines forth.

Our God comes and does not keep silence, before him is a devouring fire, and a mighty tempest all around him.

He calls to the heavens above and to the earth, that he may judge his people:

"Gather to me my faithful ones, who made a covenant with me by sacrifice!"

The heavens declare his righteousness, for God himself is judge.

"Hear, O my people, and I will speak, O Israel, I will testify against you. I am God, your God.

Not for your sacrifices do I rebuke you; your burnt offerings are continually before me.

I will not accept a bull from your house, or goats from your folds.

For every wild animal of the forest is mine, the cattle on a thousand hills.

I know all the birds of the air, and all that moves in the field is mine.

"If I were hungry, I would not tell you, for the world and all that is in it is mine.

Do I eat the flesh of bulls, or drink the blood of goats?

Offer to God a sacrifice of thanksgiving, and pay your vows to the Most High.

Call on me in the day of trouble; I will deliver you, and you shall glorify me."

THE PROPHETIC WORD:

I will return again to my place until they acknowledge their guilt and seek my face. In their distress they will beg my favor:
'Come, let us return to the Lord; for it is he who has torn, and he will heal us; he has struck down, and he will bind us up.
After two days he will revive us; on the third day he will raise us up, that we may live before him.
Let us know, let us press on to know the Lord; his appearing is as sure as the dawn;
he will come to us like the showers, like the spring rains that water the earth.'

Matthew 9:9-13. 18-26


