Additional Text: Rom 8:37-39; 1Cor 8:5-6; Phil 2:10; Col 1:15-10

Around us, we still hear the question asked, is there a God and if this world has any purpose. Paul writes in his letter to the Romans that humans may learn of God from the work of creation. But key to understanding who God is and all that God has done, is doing, and will do is found in Christ.

These verses are part of a poetic response to God's glory (Col 1:15-20) Within these words is the celebratory words of Christ's redemption and creation. Some would argue that we (humanity overall) have become less able and less skilled at singing praise to God and Christ. That we may even have forgotten how to speak the language of adoration.

When I think of what takes place on Sunday morning when we are gathered; and what happens with/through many of us throughout the week I would reject that argument. You can't help but to revel in the singing (song, prayer, word and gathering) of God's praise. Throughout the week many of you continue to worship and glorify God through your serving, your actions, what you say and do. You embody the act of poeticism and song celebrating God and Christ.

And yet, when you look at the world, I would tend to agree with the argument. Our world is a broken and hurting place. Far from God's intention of Creation. But here's the good news. Within each pocket of praising parishioners there beats a heart of spirit. A spirit that propels us onward and outward. We become the flowers overtaking the weeds. We become the gardeners planting seeds and nourishing them to fruition in what was formally desolate region. We are Christ-like following the lead of Jesus Christ in loving, grace, forgiving and healing. Thanks be to God for each one of you.
