

The prophet Jeremiah finds himself in an excruciating dilemma. Jeremiah has been preaching the Word of God (as prophets do). But, the Word of God in his case is one of "violence and destruction." God is telling the Israelite nation to change their ways or else! Certainly, an Old Testament message and one we've heard from other prophets as well.

The problem for Jeremiah is God's word is like a fire within him. He is unable to resist the urge to speak, even though he is being persecuted, ridiculed, and enduring physical harm because of what he is saying.

What is it that burns within us to say or do? What is God telling us that needs to be shared, shown, visualized, and acted upon? Sometimes, we have great difficulty in trying to nail down the fire within us. That fire can be quenched with the icy cold waters of society around us - which tells a very different message than God's.

What is it that we are to say or do that goes against the grain of everyone else and leaves us ostracized, criticized, disliked or ignored? It's painful to go against the flow of everyone else, isn't it? Sometimes we get beat up - maybe not physically, but emotionally. Either way, it's not pleasant.

And maybe we, like Jeremiah get angry at God for what we experience. We blame God and tell him to remove the burden from us. Much like Paul asked God to remove the thorn in his side. Or like Jesus did when he asked the Father to take the cup from his hands. And yet, both were very much in agreement – let it be your will God.

Accepting that this (whatever it is) is God's will can help fortify us and strengthen us where we are weakest. As impossible as it may seem, all things through God are possible. Thank you, God, for making it possible for us. Amen.

WELCOME!

To the parents of young children:

Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress those wiggles in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to engage.
- Quietly explain the parts of the service and the actions of the pastors, musicians and leaders.
- Sing the songs, pray and voice the responses. Children learn behaviors by mimicking you.
