Grow - deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

30 years ago, I lived in Florida. And on January 26, 1986 I and the nation observed a tragedy that stunned the world. The space shuttle Challenger exploded only 73 seconds into its flight from the Kennedy Space Center. All seven astronauts aboard were killed including New Hampshire teacher Christa McAuliffe. She had been selected to fly in NASA's "Teacher in Space" program.

"The whole country and the whole world were in shock when that happened, because that was the first time the United States had actually lost a space vehicle with crew on board," said former NASA astronaut Leroy Chiao, who flew three space shuttle missions during his career (in 1994, 1996 and 2000).

The suddenness of this loss affected people throughout the nation. It was a reminder of the fragility and fleetness of our lives. In one brief moment all the work, effort and expense of these men and women throughout their lives were gone.

In a nutshell, life as we know it will one day come to an end. All history will come to a climatic finale when Jesus returns. No one, except the Father, knows when that will be. Not even Jesus Christ Son of God. That conclusion could be sooner than we think, or it may be millennia away. Ultimately, we need to be prepared. Here is a life expression by which we can live:

Live as though Jesus is coming back today; Plan as though he is not coming back for a hundred years.

Prayer: Lord and Savior, bless us with understanding, compassion and zeal to live our lives with you at the heart of all we do, all we are and all we will be. *Amen.*
