Yet, Thanksgiving is a moment in our year where we are called to be just that. Deep, thoughtful, appreciative, and demonstrative (in our own unique ways) of that gratefulness... Here is a thankful prayer I wrote and delivered some years ago:

Heavenly Father, Son and Holy Spirit, fill our hearts with gratitude in all that we receive from you: For eyes that see. For ears that hear. For fingers that grasp. For knees that bend. For lungs that breathe. Let us be thankful for our families, our homes and our Savior Jesus Christ. Today we ask for nothing, and we thank you for all things. In Jesus' name, *Amen*.

We have much to be thankful for – the food we eat, the roof over our heads, the job at which we work, the family of which we are a part, the church family to which we belong, the freedom we have to experience all of these things. And so much more.

Me? I am thankful for my church (both!), my church family (all), my personal family (extended), my home, the gifts God has given me and most of all, I am thankful for God being in my life.
