Grow - deeper in our faith and relationship with God.

Pray - pray daily for family, neighbors, and others.

Study - read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

In Job 23 Job wonders (worries/tries to understand) his status with God. He is torn between an optimistic confidence (we see this in 6b-7, 10) and frustration with feeling parted from God as well as his own attempts of justifying himself before God (8-9). He is filled with planning his legal defense before the Lord (4-5) and affirming his righteousness (11-12). In other words, he feels like he is doing everything possible and really isn't to blame for this "desertion" by God. And both the suffering he has been enduring and his terror of God (13-17) remain.

Human beings tend to be motivated by self-interests: "What's in it for me?" we ask. We have adopted this sense of entitlement and self-fulfillment and our personal happiness as an end goal, but we nearly consider it to be a right. We are owed this by our status as children of God or Americans or privileged... We have subconsciously emended the Declaration of Independence to indicate what to us is indeed self-evident, that we have inalienable rights to life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness). Subsequently, our relationship to God is a reflection of our ambition toward happiness and is premised on the anticipated benefits that accompany such expected rewards.

Job, on the other hand, is disinterested in his self-righteousness as a moral principle. His faith is above and beyond self-interest. If our righteousness is for righteousness's sake (a right relationship with God) what will that look like for us? How will that motivate or change our behaviors, choices, decisions? Can we use this as a lens to perceive what God expects of us and what we should expect of ourselves? How should we live if we want to pursue a faith not based on our self-interests? (Ref. Dr. John H. Walton NIV commentary on the book of Job.)

Dear God - help us to understand how Job's story intersects with our story and give us strength of conviction in being faithful to you. *Amen.*

NOTES:

WELCOME! To the parents of young children:

Relax! God put the wiggle in children; don't feel you have to suppress those wiggles in God's house.

- Consider sitting toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to engage.
