

Grow – deeper in our faith and relationship with God. Pray – pray daily for family, neighbors, and others. Study – read the Bible, pray over what we read, ask questions.

Additional Readings: Romans 9:1-4a, 2 Cor 4:8-12, 1 Cor 9:18, 23

"A leader's calling is to shepherd the flock by being willing to die for it." Strong words indeed. Yet, this is the theme of this passage. In it, Paul teaches three things about suffering: 1) Christians take on suffering that they can easily avoid because of their commitment to the gospel of Christ, a cause that makes such suffering worthwhile. 2) People will be motivated to suffer for the gospel when they see their leaders suffer for it. 3) Leaders not only suffer for the gospel, but they also suffer for those whom they lead.

Underlying Paul's message is encouragement. Paul visits each city, and encouragement is indicated by the use of the word *parakaleo* three different times. Translated it means **to call to or for, encouragement**.

Paul, as an evangelistic preacher is an encourager. In the Bible evangelism and encouragement are often done by the same person – a healthy balance for anyone doing evangelism. There is no place in the Bible for a specialist evangelist who concentrates solely on his public ministry, leaving personal ministry to others.

Like God, Paul encouraged the people through three means. 1) God encourages us through his presence expressed in the incarnation of Christ and through the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. 2) Just as God encourages us through his Word, so too human encouragers do it by expounding the Word in teaching. 3) As God encourages us through his actions on our behalf, we encourage others through deeds of kindness. Where do you find encouragement in your ministry?

Prayer: Almighty God, God of all, subservient to none, hear our prayers. Grant us the courage to do your ministry – especially when it challenges us, inconveniences us, and especially when we face great sacrifice in the face of carrying out the mission you placed upon us. *Amen.*

To the parents of young children:
