

Ron will be missed by our church family.

Ronald Henschel, 80, of Cleveland died Tuesday morning January 24, 2022 at Sheboygan Health Services. He was born on April 28, 1942 in rural Cleveland, son of the late Harvey & Norma (Oehldrich) Henschel. Ron graduated from Kiel High School. On October 12, 1963 he was united in marriage to Jacqueline Foster in Cleveland. The couple enjoyed going to baseball games on Sundays, the annual trip to Shawano Lake for fishing and fun, going to a fish fry on Fridays and playing cards with family and friends. They shared 57 years together until she preceded him in death on June 17, 2021. Ron was employed by the Vollrath Company, retiring after over 40 years. During this time, he also was employed part-time as a weekend security guard at Lakeshore Technical College. He was a life-long member of St. James UCC, Spring Valley, where is also served on the Consistory. Ron retired as a longtime member of the Cleveland Fire Department. He was an active member of the Cleveland Fish and Game Club. He enjoyed being outdoors, hunting with family and friends, trap shooting and fishing trips to Canada. He was a member of the Cleveland Lions Club, a trustee for the Village of Cleveland. He played softball for many years and rarely missed a chance to attend the Cleveland Wildcat games.
