Water system – The last water test came back passing quality inspection. A spigot was added in the furnace room. Jason Riesterer will continue to farm two acres south of the church. Committee Reports:

Stewardship Committee – Wendy presented a comprehensive report on the status of our membership. A final letter of giving will be forwarded to members before the end of the year.

Christian Board of Education – The Christmas program practices have begun. The Sunday School will shop for the Adopt-A-Family on December 5.

Service Committee: Mary Ann Vogel will purchase new oil-cloth tablecloths for the basement tables.

The Secretary's report was reviewed and accepted by Dave and seconded by Jacob.

The Financial Secretary's report was reviewed and accepted by Dave and seconded by Glenn.

Glenn made a motion to approve the transfer of \$2,000 (the annual gain of one and one quarter percent) from the Goeke Investment account to the church Goeke Youth Fund. Dave seconded the motion.

The building and grounds committee will do a walk-through of the parsonage and church.

We reviewed and discussed Mission Fest and decided that having food would bring more people to the event. Possible drive through and pick up was discussed as an option for next year.

Christmas decorating at church was done by Cindy Call and Chris Schnelle and looks beautiful! Dave and Glenn helped set up.

Safe Sanctuary requires 2 adults to be present at youth events. A parent, consistory member or church member will be considered as needed. Meals and other expenses will be reimbursed or supplied by volunteers.

Julie will get candy for the candy bags that are distributed at the children's Christmas program.

The consistory nominee is Janelle Davis.

Glenn made a motion and Dave seconded to approve shortening one long pew to accommodate a wheelchair in church.

Dave and Glenn will set up communion for both services on Christmas Eve. Pastor will get glow sticks for the younger children to use instead of real candles.

There will be no church services on Sunday, December 26th.

Julie Mavity Maddalena from Lakeland University will be the supply pastor on January 2nd when the pastor is on vacation.

We will continue to keep covid-19 safety protocols in place with spacing between pews and communion in individual packets.

We will continue to bring up topics on what we are willing to do to attract new members.

Our next consistory meeting will be on Thursday, January 6th at 6:30.

Thanks to everyone who participated in the Christmas Cookie Exchange. I'm looking forward to doing it again next year.




