Hello everyone! Summer has officially begun and a couple of really, really hot days are behind us. Little Men's (m)anners, (e)tiquette, and (n)uance.

This would be for 3rd-5th grade boys. Some of the things I could cover are:

politeness

please, thank you, excuse me, yes sir, yes ma'am

respect of others

table manners

how to introduce yourself

how to compliment someone

how to apologize

how to invite someone to join the group if they are alone

I would not be able to cover everything, of course. And there may be something I cover that is not on this example list. However, I think it's important that our young men are given every opportunity to learn how to interact with each other with character.

June 6, 2022 6:30pm

- The meeting was called to order by President David Lorfeld. Members present were Tammy Serketich Vice-President, Wendy Henschel Treasurer, Deb La Duke Secretary, Jamey Binversie, Jackie Mueller, and Pastor Patrick Schultz. Pastor led the group in prayer.
- Motion to approve the Secretary's Report made by Wendy and seconded by Jackie. Motion carried.
- Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report made by Deb and seconded by Wendy. Motion carried.
- Pastor's Report: The Mission trip is still on track. Regular meetings continue in preparation for the week. "Be the 99" cups have been a successful fundraiser for the Ukraine efforts. They are almost sold out. Patrick will be on vacation beginning June 12.
- Building and Grounds:


