# ST. JAMES CONSISTORY

Monday, May 1, 2023 6:30 p.m.

- Motion to approve the Treasurer's Report made by Scott and seconded by Wendy.

- Pastor's Report:  
Mission/Vision Committee – Pastor reported 1<sup>st</sup> session of round table meetings had been held. Jackie and Jason reported approximately 15 people attended St. James meeting and good discussion was held. Next committee meeting will be held Sat 5/6/23. NE district meeting was held in Green Lake, all 53 churches were represented. Pastor stated it was a good meeting, he reconnected with clergy and office staff.
- Building and Grounds:
  1. Weber gravestone/tree roots- The Ash tree next to the Weber gravestone is dying and the roots are raising the stone. Recommendation is to cut the roots. Tree will eventually need to be cut down as well as several other dying Ash trees. Consistory voted to replace trees as needed. Scott knows someone that will give the church a discount.
  2. Oil Church bell – Jason and Austin will take care of oiling if needed.
  3. Check North side of building for mold/power wash – Scott and Jason will inspect and Scott will take care of cleaning if needed. There may also be a piece of trim that needs to be put back up.
  4. Check gutters -Scott will look at the gutters. Some discussion held regarding gutter covers.
  5. Check kitchen supplies; dish soap, bags, bleach etc.- Jackie and Tammy checked supplies. No need to purchase any at this time.
  6. Stove Backsplash – Jason put up the backsplash, it looks great!

  7. Parking lot – We decided not to try to repair the cracks ourselves and will re-tar the parking lot. Hopefully, this will give us a few more years before we need to resurface. Jackie will call Behnke & Sons in St. Nazianz for an estimate.
  8. Entry way chairs – Memorial monies, with consent of family have been purchased and are on order. The current chairs will be moved to Pastor's office at St. Marks.
  9. Sunday School room tiles – Jackie has a call into Badger floors to see if they are covered by warranty or if they will fix the loose tiles.
  10. Jason will purchase Alan wrench keys for consistory members.
  11. Elevator – should be "inspected" each month. Will do so at each meeting.

May, 4th,2023

The meeting was called to order on May 4th, 2023 at 6:30 p.m. Members present were: Julie Herrmann, Glenn Grunwald, Judy Steinbeck, Linda Schroeder, Ben Grunwald, Janell Davis, Larry Perronne and Pastor Schultz. Pastor led us in prayer.

The Financial Report was read by Judy and reviewed by the consistory. Larry made a motion to accept the report and Linda seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A motion was made by Linda to accept the Secretary's Report and the motion was seconded by Larry. Motion carried.

Pastor's Report:

The Mission/Vision team has sent out surveys and will be discussing them and getting back to us with the results.

Two round tables have occurred after worship giving the congregation options to discuss the surveys with a few in attendance at both churches.

The confirmands this year are Coltin Sommer, Sierra Bramstaedt and Reid Vandoske. Judy has purchased gifts for each of them. Plans were made for communion.

The Men and Women's banquet will be held on October 19th at 6:30 at St. James. Tickets will be available to purchase. Proceeds will go to scholarships.

Projects:

Larry put in a request for quotes for repairing the bell tower and trim.

Fasse Paint has traffic paint for \$20 per gallon to paint lines on the church parking lot. Rentals are not available for painting the lines but there is a walk behind machine for sale for around \$1,000. Will continue to discuss at next meeting.

Professional carpet cleaning is on hold and Jerry Jetzer did spot cleaning.

Old Business:

The washing machine has been purchased from Bitter Neumann for the parsonage.

Judy contacted Spectrum and had one of the two phone lines deleted that were not needed.

New Business:

We discussed the safe sanctuary policy. Updates will be needed regarding background checks. Events such as VBS, confirmation class, confirmation mentors, and youth group events need two adults at each without a background check. Overnight events such as campouts would need two adults and background checks. Larry will find out how long the background checks take before approval and the process to have them done. The consistory members will oversee getting the background checks done and decide how often they should be done. Also discussed the possibility of the cost of the overnight events to include the cost of the background checks.

Will decide if the Goeke youth fund should be used for payment or include the fee when fundraising. It will be decided if checks will not be cut for the event until the background checks are done. Final details will be confirmed at the next meeting.

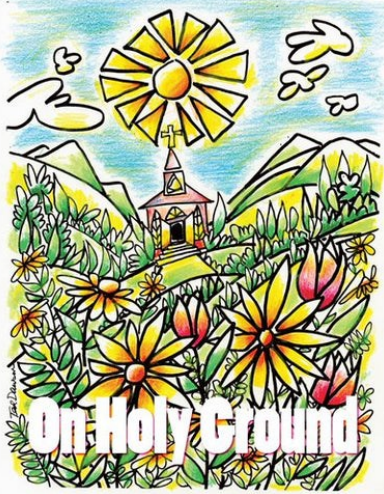
## CONGRATULATIONS TO MICHAEL BELITZ!

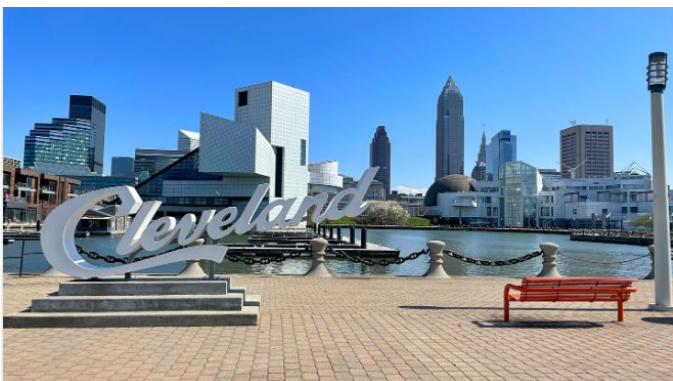

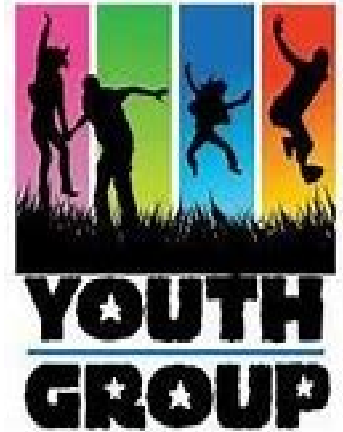

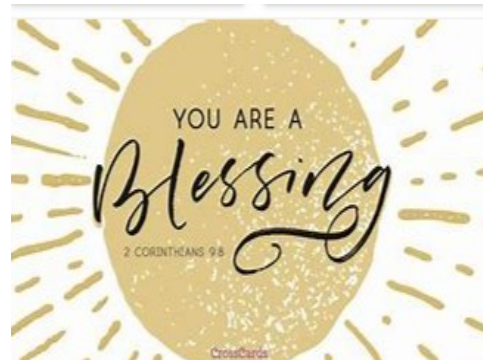
