Rev. Dr. Patrick Schultz:

Lent will be upon us before the end of February. It begins with Ash Wednesday (held on February 26th this year) and is the six week period leading up to Easter. While Advent is a celebration and time of great anticipation, Lent is typically seen as a time of solemnity and preparation for the celebration of the death and resurrection of Christ on Easter.



Lent invites us to make our minds and hearts ready for remembering Jesus' life, death and body resurrection. Oftentimes sermon series are developed and delivered on such themes as healing, forgiveness, or (as I did last year) the "I Am" statements found in the Gospel of John. This year I plan on sharing parts of the story of Jesus' journey to the cross.

What path he took; who he talked with; who he healed; and what he taught. Both Wednesdays and Sundays will focus on this journey with Sundays being more celebratory in nature.

I look forward to taking this journey with you!

As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man dressed in a white robe sitting on the right side, and they were alarmed. "Don't be alarmed," he said. "You are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who was crucified. He has risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. Opportunities to become involved and serve according to your spiritual gifts


Our direction in ministry/mission/outreach

COLLEEN LAUERSDORF'S AWARD WINNING CHILI RECIPE!

- $2\ (14\mbox{-ounce})$ cans fire roasted diced to matoes
- 1 (14-ounce) can regular diced tomatoes
- 2 cups frozen corn
- 2 (14-ounce) cans black beans, drained and rinsed
- 2 (4-ounce) cans diced chilies
- 2 packages Hidden Valley Ranch Dressing mixes (1 regular and 1 fiesta I used 1 ½ regular and ½ fiesta for a milder taste)
- 3 (8-ounce) packages cream cheese, cubed
- 1 tablespoon chili powder (I used ½ tablespoon for a milder taste)
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder

- 1 teaspoon cumin
- 3 pounds cooked shredded chicken breasts
- 1 (16-ounce can) chicken broth (I used 32 ounces to make the chili thinner)

Garnish - corn chips and shredded cheese

In a large soup kettle, pour in the tomatoes, corn, black beans, green

chilies, dressing mixes, cream cheese, chili powder, and cumin. Heat

chili, stirring until the cream cheese has melted. Add the cooked

shredded chicken and simmer chili for at least 30 minutes until chili is hot. Serve with corn chips and shredded cheese.



Do justice, love kindness, walk humbly

Back Bay Mission's **Homelessness Outreach** program provides people living in homelessness with the resources necessary for survival. This includes material goods like tents and hygiene products. It also includes referrals to other programs that might help a person gain housing.

The **Micah Day Center** provides one location where homeless and low-income individuals and families can receive services. People can take showers, have laundry done, use computers, receive mail, and meet with caseworkers in a safe, welcoming, and comfortable place.

Home At Last provides permanent supportive housing to individuals and families who are disabled and chronically homeless. Through this program, people receive housing and support that gets them off the street and helps them work towards independent housing. Back Bay Mission commits to working with these individuals and families until they become self-sufficient.
