ST. MARK'S CONSISTORY MEETING

October 6, 2022

The meeting was called to order on October 6, 2022 at 6:30 p.m. Members present: Julie Herrmann, Jacob Grunwald, Judy Steinbeck, Louise Jetzer, Glenn Grunwald, Janell Davis, Larry Perronne and Pastor Schultz.

The Secretary's report was reviewed and a motion was made by Janell and seconded by Jacob to approve. Motion carried.

The financial report was reviewed and a motion was made by Larry and seconded by Louise to approve. Motion carried.

The Mission/Vision Team will discuss options for activities such as a silent auction, special music, and meal times together.

Pastor would like the opportunity to ask questions and review the discussions made by the joint consistories regarding his salary and benefits at the joint consistory meeting.

The quote to replace the screens on the parsonage is \$1,760 and will be replaced by Ellerman Glass in Manitowoc.

The railings on the porch will be replaced along with the siding in 2023.

A walk through of the grounds will be done one time a year and has been completed.

Larry made a motion to have pastor and Jerry do research on adding better lighting outside the parsonage and the church and to bring to next consistory meeting for approval. Louise seconded the motion. Motion carried.

A new contract is being written up at MEI Total Elevator Solutions to replace our contract with Otis which will be signed and go into effect on January 1, 2023.

Cindy and Dave Call have volunteered to make the meal for Mission Fest with help from the congregation. There is a signup sheet to bring needed items and to help with set up and take down.

Janell has found flameless tapered battery-operated candles to replace the candles currently in the candelabras. A motion was made by Larry to purchase one box of six on Amazon to ensure proper fit and brightness. Louise seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Larry made a motion to sign the annual contract for T&L Services as presented for lawn care and snow removal. Janell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

St. James is hosting the United Church Men and Women's banquet in October of 2023. Larry made a motion that St. Mark's Consistory will help co-host by helping with preparations for the event. Janell seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Judy will get a quote on getting the carpet cleaned throughout the church. A motion was made by Janell to purchase a carpet cleaner for small spills. Larry seconded the motion.

Our new hymnals include most of the music that is in the binders in the pews so the binders will be removed.

The carport fund will be added to the agenda for the annual meeting to discuss what our future plans are for the project.

The joint consistory meeting will be on October 17th at 6:00 p.m. at St. James.

The next consistory meeting is scheduled for November 10th at 6:30 p.m.

Jake made a motion to adjourn the meeting. Larry seconded the motion. Motion carried.
