October 4th is World Communion Sunday. While most of us have heard of World Communion Sunday, all may not know from whence it came. According to the National Council of Churches, World Communion Sunday began in 1936 in the Presbyterian Church and was adopted by the Federal Council of Churches in 1940. Since then the celebration of this sacrament has grown into an international celebration of Christian unity.



It is a day when we together, as the Body of Christ, in universal practice break bread with one another and remember the night of Jesus' betrayal. We remember the sacrament Jesus instituted which we now call the Lord's Supper as an everlasting remembrance of his sacrifice.

World Communion Sunday is a time for remembering that around the globe - in different languages, with different traditions and customs, and in various forms of liturgy - the Lord's Supper is celebrated throughout Christendom by and in the power of the Holy Spirit. At its best, World Communion Sunday serves as a joyous and meaningful partaking in Jesus' sacred meal with his friends; and an opening of our experiences to the unity and diversity of different Christian traditions from around the world.

On October 4th, we will celebrate World Communion at both churches. Giving thanks for the generosity of Pat and Noreen Flook who have purchased wafer and juice kits for St. James and St. Mark's, Communion will be served with sealed containers (1 container = wafer and juice). The Communion Liturgy will remain the same while the way in which we serve Communion will be slightly different.

Those who would like a kit (per person) to have Communion at home via our Online service can pick up their kit(s) at the St. Mark's office. Please contact Pastor or Karen for open office times/days.

Pastor will have additional kits and will be able to serve Communion during visits while keeping safe distances, wearing masks...



#### Confirmation 2020-2021

Confirmation classes are ready to begin! And this year we have a fine group of young gentlemen and ladies from both churches. For all church members and friends who are receiving this email (hard copy or email) I'd like you to cut this article out (print it out) and put it in a prominent place where you will see it at least once a day. I'll tell you why in a moment.

Our first meeting takes place on October 7<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 PM at St. Mark's in the Fellowship Hall downstairs. There we will have introductions and go through our materials – handing out books/binders and folders I have had put together for the confirmands.

We will walk through our schedule; discuss expectations and projects for the 20-21 year. And I will answer your questions to the best of my ability. If I don't have an answer then and there, I will get one for you. Confirmation is an important part of our youth's spiritual development. It is a continuation of the spiritual education and maturity learned from early childhood into young adulthood from our Sunday school classes and Sunday morning worship services. At the end of confirmation classes each confirmand will need to make a decision to join the church as a confirmed youth. It is my task (one I welcome wholeheartedly) to ready our confirmands so their decision is based on a solid foundation and is an informed decision.

I expect confirmation classes to meet in-person this year; however, as you know "things can change!" If we need to move to an online confirmation, we can do so with a few modifications of the calendar and overall expectations.

This year we will have mentors for each confirmand. Last year's mentor program went so well, we are building upon that success and lessons learned to create a meaningful year for the confirmands. We will use two primary resources in confirmation: *My Confirmation* (UCC Guide through confirmation) and *Get Acquainted With Your Bible*. There will be a mentor guide for the mentor(s) and a separate journal for the confirmand for their time together.



This monthly update will let you know what has been going on with SCIO and will tell of needs they have in case you feel it in your heart to help. Lisa Stephan, Executive Director of SCIO, is going to be our Mission Fest Speaker this year at *both* churches!

The last summer farmers market is October 31st! We will continue to offer the Double Your Bucks Program, sponsored by St. Nicholas Hospital, every market day throughout the month. Stay tuned for more information about our winter pop-up market, starting in November!

**Bridgeway & Beyond Update**: Room 1, 4, 5- This mom of 4 recently secured full time employment as well as a casual/part time job. Due to COVID this mother struggled with finding sustainable income to support her large family (she receives no child support). Securing both jobs has been a true blessing! She and her children have participated in weekly counseling since coming into the Bridgeway program a year ago. The trauma they experienced was tremendous so living in a supportive environment has been truly beneficial. Mom and kiddos really appreciate the love and support they receive in the Bridgeway program and are so grateful for the extra assistance they have been given during the hardest times of their lives.

Room 6-This mom of 1 recently completed an Intensive Outpatient Group for substance abuse. It was a struggle for this mom to leave an abusive relationship, however once she did, she hasn't looked back. She and her daughter have grown leaps and bounds since entering the Bridgeway program! Her 2 year old daughter came into Bridgeway not walking or showing any emotion due to the extent of trauma she experienced in her young life. Within 2 months she began walking and even saying a few words. She is now such a happy little girl who is truly thriving! She even loves to give hugs! Mom is connected to the W2 program, attends weekly counseling, has a sponsor and attends AA meetings. She is determined to make a better life for herself and her daughter.

Trisha's house- This mom of 3 continues to work at a local factory. She also started her own business this summer selling macarons! "Stephanie's Sugar Fix" has been an amazing hit in the community! In fact, it's gotten so popular she has a hard time keeping up with the dozens of orders she receives each week!!! At \$20 per dozen, she is able to do what she loves AND put money away in savings! She is so grateful and feels so blessed to be able to live the life she once dreamed of!

Outreach/Aftercare- Our Case Manager has been really busy these last few months assisting approximately 30 families in outreach and aftercare.
