
October 24th we will be welcoming new members into both St. James and St. Mark's congregation.

Thank you for your consideration and for helping us in this worthwhile project.








Outreach has donated to Raymond Henschel's Humane Society drive. Discussion was had about up and coming donations and meeting those financial needs.
