



Dear Parents,

All are back in school by now, settling into new (old) routines of early mornings, full day classes, evenings of homework and other school related activities. Sunday school for St. Mark's and St. James will begin before the end of September. And Confirmation will have its first meeting on Wednesday, September 7th, beginning at 6:00pm – held at St. Mark's UCC.

While I fully expect our confirmation classes to meet in-person; we have Zoom capabilities and can move to online confirmation with a few modifications of the calendar and overall expectations \sim if we need to. For our first meeting, September 7th, I would like parents/guardians to attend. It's important and beneficial for all to understand the overall expectations to have everyone on the same page. We will look at the expectations for the confirmands and parents, as well as some of the projects we will be working on.
