HOSPITALITY

To say that church is all about people - might be surprising to some. It might lead to a response like, "it's all about God!" Which would indeed be true. The two statements are not mutually exclusive. Church is about peoples relationship with and to God. At the very crux, people need to know God loves them, that they are of supreme value, and that their life is meaningful. People also need to know they aren't alone; that when they face difficulties they are surrounded by a community of grace; and they don't have to figure out absolutely everything on their own!

People need to know that when they have family tensions, self-doubt, despair or depression, financial hard times or temptations that hurt themselves or others, they are not in it alone. People need to know the peace that runs deeper than an absence of conflict and hope that sustains them through the most painful times of grief.

Many of us who are already "in church" understand this or get this. And yet, there is a whole world of people, right outside our doorsteps, who have no connection or relationship with a church. As pastor, follower of Christ, preacher, teacher, and someone in desperate need of Christ (all the time!) I want to do everything I can to help people come to know God's love and grace through Christ.

Inviting people into a relationship with Jesus is paramount as a follower of Christ. Check out Matthew 28:19-20! One way to invite and welcome others is to show excellent hospitality. We want people to know that we really care about them here. They are not just a number. They are not just a \$\$ amount. They are not an outsider. They are invited and welcomed into the Body of Christ.




THE NEWSLETTER.....

However, that was not the case, and the numerous misfeeds and resulting service call slowed the process. Next month will definitely be better with the new machine!

Speaking of the newsletter....... I'm not sure if you're aware of what is involved in the monthly newsletter preparation. As you notice, this month there's a new newsletter format. Much time was spent researching and gathering sample newsletters from other churches. To prepare it, I rely on receiving the newsletter articles from everyone in a timely manner. Typing takes time and I do my best proofreading to catch any errors BEFORE printing. Then there's the printing, which the last months has been a huge frustration because the old copier is 'just barely hanging on'. There are many misfeeds and very loud squealing noises when making the copies.

Another way you can help speed up the process is by sending me newsletter articles as soon as they're ready, not waiting until the deadline. It is much more efficient if I work on the newsletter throughout the month instead of working to do it all in a day or two. Additionally, I don't know everyone or all that goes on in both churches and appreciate you sharing anything that needs to included in the newsletter and/or the bulletin insert.
